Seattle Pacific University's MEd in Curriculum and Instruction (C&I) provides four pathways for teachers to bolster their instructional expertise and leadership capacity. Develop your skills in educational theory, research, and best practices to enhance your ability to create culturally sustainable and inclusive learning spaces that impact the health of our schools.

Depending upon your specific professional goals and interests, there are four areas of emphasis: Curriculum and Instruction, Teacher Leadership, Multilingual Learner, and Self-Designed.

The Self-Designed emphasis is for graduates who want to craft a program that best fits their professional goals. With the program chair, students design a course of study drawing from our different graduate programs, including Literacy, Language, and Equity; Educational Leadership; Digital Education Leadership; and Multilingual Learner instruction.

Admission Requirements

Applicants must submit the following items to Graduate Admissions (<http://client-snap.dev8.leefrog.com/spu/external.html?link=https://spu.edu/graduate-admissions>):

- Online application (<http://client-snap.dev8.leefrog.com/spu/external.html?link=https://admissions.spu.edu/apply/>) and \$50 application processing fee.
- Official transcript(s) from each college and/or university attended.
 - If your degree is not from a U.S. college or university, please arrange for your transcript to be evaluated by a NACES member (<http://client-snap.dev8.leefrog.com/spu/external.html?link=http://www.naces.org/>)-recognized credential service. Acceptable credential services include, but are not limited to, World Education Services (<http://client-snap.dev8.leefrog.com/spu/external.html?link=https://www.wes.org/>) (WES) and Foundation for International Services (<http://client-snap.dev8.leefrog.com/spu/external.html?link=https://www.fis-web.com/>) (FIS).
- Personal statement (1–2 pages).
- Résumé.
- Two letters of recommendation, at least one of which addresses applicant's leadership abilities and/or teaching skills.
- 3.0 cumulative undergraduate GPA.¹
- Copy of front and back of teaching certificate (if applicable).

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If cumulative undergraduate GPA is less than 3.0, applicant must take the GRE with a preferred minimum combined verbal and quantitative score of 950. (On the revised GRE exam, preferred minimum scores of verbal: 148 and quantitative: 147.)

Application Deadlines

- Autumn Quarter entry: August 15
- Winter Quarter entry: November 15
- Spring Quarter entry: February 15
- Summer Sessions entry: May 15
