The Wesleyan and Methodist Studies Certificate program is designed to provide you with a deeper understanding of Wesleyan heritage, doctrine, and ministry, specifically related to the movements of Methodist denominations. The certificate is designed for laypeople who serve in ministerial settings, candidates for ordination in the Free Methodist Church, and those who already have a master's degree in theology but are seeking deeper training in this area. This certificate can be completed in one year, but students are invited to move through the program at a pace that works for them.

- A graduate online application (<http://admissions.spu.edu/apply/>) for admission.
- A \$50 processing fee.
- Official transcripts from all undergraduate institutions.
- A resume or CV
- A typed personal statement. Statements should be three to four pages in length (double spaced). The statement should address your career objectives, a narrative of your personal Christian experience, rationale for seeking the degree and choosing to attend SPU, and other insights you deem appropriate.
