ACCREDITATION AND AFFILIATION

The history of the growth of Seattle Pacific University is linked to the educational community of which it is a part. In successive steps from 1921 to 1937, the University was accredited by the Washington State Board of Education. Since 1936, the University has been accredited by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (http://www.nwccu.org/) (NWCCU).

Seattle Pacific is included on the approved list of the Board of Regents of the State of New York and is a member of the Association of American Colleges & Universities (http://www.aacu.org/) and of the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education (http://aacte.org/). The University is also a charter member of the Christian College Consortium (http://www.ccconsortium.org/) and a collaborative partner of the Council for Christian Colleges and Universities (http://www.cccu.org/), and its credits are recognized by members of the various regional associations and by leading graduate schools throughout the country.

The University is approved by the U.S. government for education of veterans and their dependents under the applicable public laws and by the Washington Student Achievement Council's State Approving Agency (SAA) for enrollment of those eligible to receive educational benefits under Title 38 and Title 10, U.S. Code.
