INTERNATIONAL SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT (BA)

Program Description

The International Sustainable Development major prepares students for vocations in international development through applied skills training and direct, cross-cultural experiences.

The major provides students with a firm theoretical foundation, as well as the professional and technical skills necessary for post-graduation work in the field. Students will examine development challenges and the means to resolve them from a Christian perspective and develop handson project management skills, while engaging with both hypothetical and real-world problems at the local and global levels.

The major equips students with a comparative understanding of development in both developed and developing nations through directed study, applied skills training, analytical research, and direct, cross-cultural experiences—including a required placement with local and international development organizations.

New Majors Onboarding

All newly admitted majors must attend this onboarding as an introduction to the School of Business, Government, and Economics. Please make note that there are no substitutions for this degree requirement.

Entering and Completing the Major

In order to earn a degree, you must complete at least one academic major. SPU encourages students to explore various academic paths, so if you change your mind about a major, or want to include an additional program, you are able to do so, as outlined below.

Note that the University encourages you to enter your chosen major(s) as soon as you have determined it and are eligible to join it, especially by the start of your junior year. Students who transfer as juniors and seniors should enter a major within their first two quarters at SPU.

- If this is your first quarter at SPU and you identified a major in this
 department as your first choice on your application for admission to
 the University, you have gained entry to the major. To change or add
 a major, follow these instructions (https://spu.atlassian.net/l/cp/
 a3th1keb/).
- If you are an SPU student with an SPU cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better, follow these instructions (https://spu.atlassian.net/l/cp/a3th1keb/) to enter a major in this department.
- The University requires a grade of C- or better in all classes that apply to a major; however, programs may require higher minimum grades in specific courses. You may repeat an SPU course only once for a higher grade.
- To advance in this program, meet with your faculty advisor regularly
 to discuss your grades, course progression, and other indicators
 of satisfactory academic progress. If your grades or other factors
 indicate that you may not be able to successfully complete the major
 or minor, your faculty advisor can work with you to explore options,
 which may include choosing a different major.

 You must complete the major requirements that are in effect in the SPU Undergraduate Catalog for the year you enter the major.

Sophomore Notes

- If you have not yet applied to the major, apply now! Applications are accepted year round and require good academic standing (2.0 or higher SPU cumulative GPA).
- Begin looking for an internship over the summer after your sophomore year. Recruiting often begins 6 to 12 months prior to an internship start date.

Junior Notes

- The bulk of the major will be completed during the Junior Year.
- Generally, internships are also completed at this time or during the summer quarter following completion of junior year.

Senior Notes

- If studying abroad, please be sure to meet with the ISD director before you depart in order to review your study abroad courses and to determine which ones will fulfill the major requirements
- ISD 4940 International Sustainable Development Practicum must be taken in the same quarter in which you are completing your internship.
- BUS 3680 Social Enterprise & BUS 3682 Social Venture Planning will prepare you for the SVPC, or you can do a study abroad or additional language.
